VOCATION VIEWS

The Christian Vocation has expression through marriage, single life, priesthood and consecrated life. Our call to holiness is to answer God's call to build the Kingdom of God. 'Let the little children come to me; ... for it is to such as these that the Kingdom of God belongs.'

GOSPEL SUMMARY

At the beginning of this gospel, Jesus reminded his listeners of what God's original plan was for marriage. A man and a woman were to be united and live as one. It was simple. But as relationships developed, marriage must have been as complicated then as it is now because Moses had to make concessions for the people. Scholars still struggle with the words of Jesus in this gospel because imperfect relationships continue to exist today. What is clear in this reading is that in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven we must accept it as a gift. Children in ancient times as well as our own, depend entirely on their parents (or society) for their care. To children, everything is a gift because they can't earn anything. That is how it must be for us if we are to accept the Kingdom of God.

DIRECTIVES FROM THE BISHOP'S OFFICE

We recommend the following practices that may help with the combat of the H1N1 flu virus and may be adopted on an interim basis.

1. Parishioners are advised to refrain from shaking hands during the sign of peace and simply bow or say "Peace be with you" to fellow parishioners.
2. Extraordinary ministers should receive Communion only in the hand.
3. Communion should be distributed only in the hand.
4. Communion should not be distributed from the cup.
